


COME TO CHURCH WITH YOUR CHILDREN

We encourage you to bring your children to church from birth. Church offers children and families a community of faith, love and hope to belong to.


Other church members can become the child's extended family who commit to support parents in their spiritual parenting and contribute to the child's experience of God's love.

- At church children learn that God loves all types of people, young and old, happy and grumpy, abled and disabled.
- Make regular church attendance a priority: On Sunday we go to church, on Monday we go to school and work. Encourage your child to love and enjoy it- to talk about what they learn and who they meet.
- Look for a church where children are welcomed, nurtured, valued and celebrated and encouraged to participate and contribute.
- Prioritise your children's participation in your church community, so together church and home can nurture the gift of faith that is growing in them.

CREATE A SPIRITUAL THIRST IN YOUR CHILD



Everyday - in every way, you can create a spiritual thirst in your child. A thirst to know God, to enjoy His forgiveness, and to benefit from His love. You will enable your child to grow up knowing he is not alone in the universe. And your child will never lack a moral compass to guide his way.

You do not have to be perfect to be your child's spiritual equipper. We all have self-doubt and worry we might "mess up" or not give the correct answer. But if we do our best God will do the rest. We can't always "quench the thirst" of our child's spiritual needs, but we can "create the thirst" by trying some of the following suggestions in this booklet.

Seize any occasion to speak of God - When you're boogey boarding together in the sea, or walking in the forest, talk about how God has blessed us.

Weave spiritual lessons into your daily conversations

- Seek teachable moments when out driving or walking, when they are watching TV, quarreling with their siblings or telling you about what happened at school.

Around your home, place visible reminders that testify to your faith in God – Your Bible, journal, Christian books next to your bed, favourite quotes or Bible verses stuck on the fridge, Christian music, books, DVDs... etc.

- 4. **Pray** for one another's highs and lows.
- 5. **Bless** one another before turning the lights out each night

TALK

Mark Holmen in 'Faith Begins at Home' helps parents **T.R.A.I.N** to talk faith with their children:

T- Time is our most precious commodity. We can be creative about where and when we 'find time' E.g. car time, Sick time, Bed time. Meal time, holiday time, one on one time.

R-Repetition. Deuteronomy means 'repetition of the Law' Start a habit of blessing, praying, reading the Bible. Start small and do it over and over again through the years.

A-Acceptance of one another. Faith talk is about listening and receiving as much as talking and giving.

I-Intentionality – Involve Christ in all areas of your life and parenting and be prepared to talk faith in the good times and the bad.

N- Never Ending dialogue with your childreneven when they have grown up.



PRAY

Teach your children how to pray.

EXPLAIN:




This can be done in our minds or out loud.

ROLE MODEL:




Pray for the family as your set off on a journey.

Pray with your child at bedtime inviting him/her to contribute to the prayers.


Pray a blessing for your child as he/she leaves for school and teach him/her to do the same for you.

AT MEALTIMES...Make mealtimes a special family time of thanksgiving and sharing. Sing or say grace, share your highs and lows

BLESS

The act of blessing -- a simple, spoken prayer for God's favour to rest on someone, accompanied by a symbolic physical gesture -- is a powerful vehicle of God's grace.

Words cannot mechanically or magically produce heavenly benefits in our children's lives but when spoken daily over the years, provides an occasion for God's love and our love to be communicated simply and effectively to our children. As that love is confirmed again and again in their minds and hearts, it gradually transforms them. There are several purposes:

- 1/ **PRAYER OF FAITH** on behalf of the children is exercised when parents, standing in a God-ordained place of authority and responsibility, speak words of God's favour over their children.
- 2/ AFFIRMS A CHILD"S WORTH and IMPORTANCE. When we pause from our hectic schedules to bless our children, it says to them: "You are valuable; you are precious to me and to God."
- 3/ **ASSURANCE** a blessing assures children that their parents and their heavenly Father love them and desire to protect and provide for them. Thus it cultivates a feeling of safety and security -- a feeling heightened by the aspect of physical touch.
- 4/ **A RHYTHM** a daily blessing adds a rhythm, a sense of regularity, to our children's lives that's comforting and stabilizing. This is especially true when we use the same words to bless them each day and give the blessing at the same point in our daily schedule.

5/ MAKES A DIFFERENCE IN US AS PARENTS. Setting aside time to bless our children provides us with a daily reminder of how precious they are and a chance to refocus our thoughts on their welfare, especially if there has been any conflict during the day.

For all these reasons, a daily blessing can enrich your family. The investment of time is small, yet the rewards last a lifetime.

Here's how to get started:

- 1. Choose a regular time and place to bless your children. No need to be rigid, but structure and consistency can be important, especially for younger children. Bedtime is often preferred.
- 2. Choose words that express clearly and succinctly the blessing you desire for your children. Try one of the blessings in the box below, or create your own. Preface it with the child's name and end with the words, "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen,"
- 3. If your children are old enough to understand, explain to them why you'll be blessing them. They'll be much more cooperative if they know something about what you're doing and why. Older children especially may at first be reluctant, but in time, they'll come to look forward to it.

4. When you bless your children, touch them in some meaningful way. Make the sign of the cross on their forehead or lay your hand on their hand. Parental touch is always important to children, but especially during a blessing. The scriptural examples of blessing almost always include some such physical gesture as a visible sign of the invisible grace God grants through the act.

A Blessing with Actions

Face each other. As parent makes the sign of the & on child's forehead he/she says:

"(Name) May God bless you and keep you. May God's light shine around you (wave your hands around child's head and shoulders) and through you (lift up child's arms into the air) and grant you his peace (place your hands on child's shoulders). Amen."

Repeat with child blessing parent.

More Blessings

"The Lord bless you and keep you, The Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace" (Numbers 6:24-26)

Or a shorter adaption:

The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make His face shine on you and be gracious to you and give you peace.

Or 'I pray that the Lord will bless and protect you, that He will show you mercy and kindness. May the Lord be good to you and give you peace' (Numbers 6:14-26 CEV)
