Take some time as a family to reflect on the last few months. and share with one another the ways you experienced the friendship of Jesus. Give thanks!!



A cairn is a stack of stones built as a memorial or landmark. Throughout the Old Testament, cairns were erected to mark places of holy significance, where God's presence had been encountered by God's people. Likewise, in our lives, there are seasons and moments that are important to mark. As we come to the end of Eastertide, reflect together as a family on what you have learned, thought about and prayed for. Then together, create a cairn in your garden or in your home to remind you of this time together.
